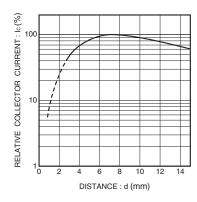


Fig.1 Relative output vs. distance

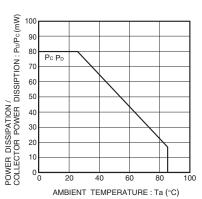


Fig.4 Power dissipation / collector power dissipation vs. ambient temperature

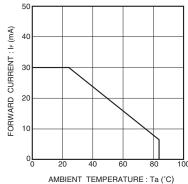


Fig.2 Forward current vs. ambient temperature

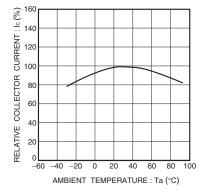


Fig.5 Relative output vs. ambient

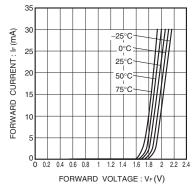


Fig.3 Forward current vs. forward voltage

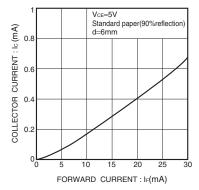
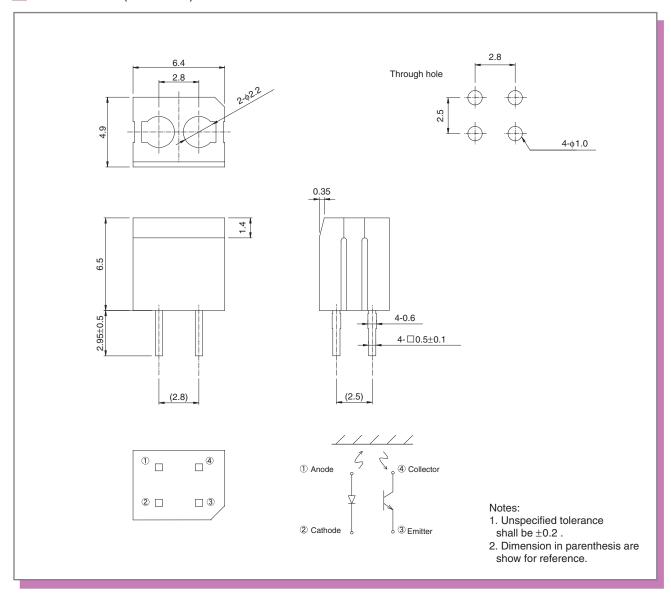


Fig.6 Collector current vs. forward current

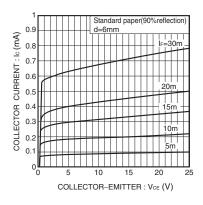


Fig.7 Output characteristics

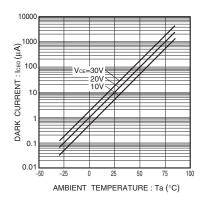


Fig.8 Dark current vs. ambient temperature
